What is this Workshop about?

This week-long workshop invites children to explore Indian mythology through the vibrant lens of folk painting. Through storytelling and hands-on craft, participants will discover traditional art styles like Madhubani, Warli, Kalamkari, and Pattachitra.

Each day, they'll create tiny artifacts such as painted coasters, fabric scrolls, clay tiles, and bookmarks while learning about motifs, patterns, and symbolism. The workshop encourages creativity, cultural awareness, and artistic expression.

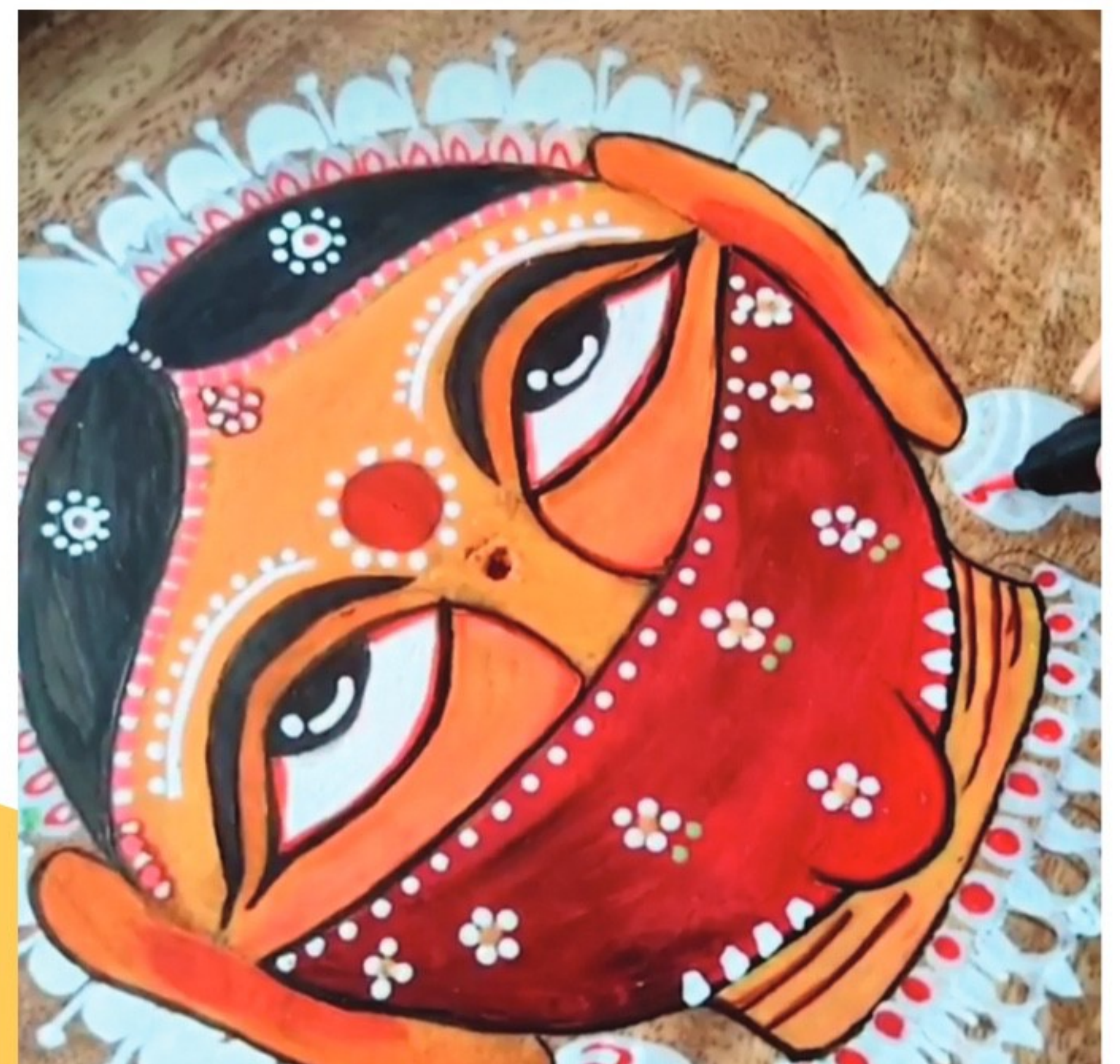
In the final session, children will showcase their creations and share the stories behind them, taking home not just handmade keepsakes but also a deeper appreciation for India's rich visual storytelling traditions.

What will you learn?

1. Explore mythology and folk art through stories and activities.
2. Sketch characters and design artifacts with folk motifs.
3. Paint and decorate using traditional techniques.
4. Showcase creations and share their stories.

Gargi Raychaudhuri is an Associate Faculty in the Furniture and Interior Design department at NID Ahmedabad and has also served as Visiting Faculty at NID Andhra Pradesh and NID Bangalore. She integrates storytelling, folk art, and spatial design to promote emotional well-being in design education.

For her Master of Design project, Gargi designed the West Bengal State Design Centre in collaboration with WBIDC. She holds a Bachelor of Architecture from the University School of Architecture and Planning, New Delhi.

A trained Madhubani artist, Gargi founded "Artsyhooter," an online studio focused on Indian folk tales. Her work explores art as a medium for healing and well-being, with academic interests in systems design, cultural identity, and the impact of spatial environments on mental health.
